welcome baskets & first-call parents

We are committed to providing resources and support to families from early diagnosis through the rest of their child's life. We offer welcome baskets to parents upon the first call to our organization, with educational materials and information. The Down Syndrome Association for Families invests in building relationships with medical providers throughout the year. Averaging 75 visits to hospitals and clinics throughout the city, the Medical Outreach team provides up-to-date information, education, materials, and training for physicians and staff on supporting parents receiving the diagnosis of Down syndrome for their child. The Medical Outreach team is a group of volunteers that dedicate their time to reaching out to communities across the state to reach parents who are welcoming a child with Down syndrome.

Our members are encouraged to connect with other families with similar experiences, as well as with individuals who have expertise in Down syndrome-related topics. We believe that this type of support is key in giving parents the confidence they need to advocate for their child's education, healthcare, and social opportunities.

DSAF also provides comprehensive parent education programs. These programs offer an interactive, comprehensive approach to helping families understand and navigate the Down syndrome journey. We believe that information and support are paramount for families and provide resources for medical, educational, and community programs. Our parents also provide invaluable support to one another, often forming long-lasting friendships in the process.

strokes of luck golf tournament

In 2022, DSAF hosted a new fundraising event, the Strokes of Luck golf tournament. We aim to exponentially expand this opportunity by securing additional sponsorships and donations in 2023. As an incentive, we are offering a Dormie Network Vacation package to one major donor. We hope that this added benefit can help increase the level of participation and funds generated by this event year over year, benefiting our members by providing more programming opportunities.


